WCPG Phase II Pathological Gambling Training (Must provide proof of Phase I completion)

This track provides fifteen hours of training from the Wisconsin Council on Problem Gambling phase 2 curriculum. This program is designed for those participants who are or plan to be working with problem gamblers and their families in a variety of clinical settings. Participants are encouraged to incorporate this information into their clinical practice. Participants will learn about the effects of gambling on the individual, family and community and use the information to help those who fall into their own professional scope of practice. Topics that will be covered include: history and prevalence of gambling and problem gambling, types of gamblers, definitions of gambling, typology of problem gamblers, screening and assessment, co-morbid and co-occurring disorders, family counseling, and crisis intervention. *Certified by the International Council on Problem Gambling, EACC, Social Work, Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing and Wisconsin Association for Marriage and Family Therapy.*
